A couple of months ago, Bribie Island Community Nursery President Dave (top bloke!) informed us that the Bribie Island State School had an automatic composter that was no longer being used and suggested we make contact to see if we could use it at the garden . After discussions with the school and applying through the school's tendering process we can happily announce that we were successful! Thank you Bribie Island State School.

The On-Site Composting Apparatus (OSCA) can turn green waste into beautiful compost in around 2 -3 weeks. Hopefully it isn't too long before you can all meet OSCA but just a word of warning - he is a very big and very hungry boy. - we will be needing a lot of your kitchen and garden scraps to keep him happy.

BECOME A MEMBER
